

Kansas State University Linux User Group

Constitution & Bylaws

Article I

Name and Purpose

Section 1

This organization shall be known as the *Kansas State University Linux Users Group*.

Section 2

It shall be the mission of this organization to advocate the use of, educate potential users of, and support current users of the Linux operating system.

Article II

Membership

Section 1

Membership shall be open to any KSU student, faculty, or staff, or any person in the surrounding community who wishes to take part in the Linux movement.

Section 2

Membership shall uphold the the KSU non-discrimination policy.

Section 3

Membership is open to all persons in the community. All members must be be subscribed to the organization mailing list.

Article III

Officers

Section 1

The officers and duties of this organization shall be:

President:

- Organize meetings and events
- Manage public relations

Vice President:

- Manage public relations
- Maintain organization website

Secretary/Treasurer:

- Maintain current member list
- Organize finances

Section 2

Officers shall be chosen by general election at the spring meeting and shall serve a term of one year.

Section 3

Officers may be removed by a two-thirds majority vote if they are found to be in dereliction of their duties. This vote may be called by any member and must be seconded.

Section 4 (balance clause)

Non-student members may be removed by a two-thirds vote of student members in order to maintain 80% student membership as required by OSAS for a student organization.

Article IV

Dues and Fees

Section 1

There shall be no membership fee or dues associated with this organization.

Article V

Meetings

Section 1

Meetings shall be held at the beginning of each semester with a special meeting after Spring Break for the election of officers.

Section 2

Special meetings may be called by the president or adviser at any time.

Section 3

Quorum shall consist of two-thirds of the current active members.

Article VI

Committees

Section 1

There shall be no standing committees.

Section 2

Special committees may be created at the discretion of the president or adviser.

Article VII

Amendments

Section 1

The constitution and/or bylaws may be changed, after 2 weeks notification and review period, by a 2/3 majority vote at a regular meeting.
